Second Judicial District announces three District Court vacancies Commission sets date to select nominees

The Second Judicial District Nominating Commission will meet at the Denver City and County Building on Monday and Tuesday, June 13 and 14, 2022, to interview and select nominees for appointment by the governor to the office of district judge for the Second Judicial District (Denver County) to fill three vacancies. The vacancies will be created by retirements of Chief Judge Michael A. Martinez, Judge Michael J. Vallejos, and Judge Edward D. Bronfin. The vacancies will be effective on Sept. 1, 2022, July 30, 2022, and Jan. 10, 2023, respectively.

To be eligible, the applicant must be a qualified elector of the Second Judicial District at the time of investiture and must have been admitted to the practice of law in Colorado for five years. The annual salary for these positions as of July 1, 2022, is \$183,816. The initial term of office of a district judge is a provisional term of two years; thereafter, the incumbent district judge, if retained by the voters, has a term of six years.

You must submit the names of not fewer than three nor more than five individuals from whom you are requesting a letter of reference. Such letters of reference shall be strictly confidential. They must be submitted directly by the author and they should be submitted by email as described below in paragraph 3. It is your responsibility to ensure that all letters of reference are submitted by the filing deadline listed in paragraph 4.
