



Chief Judge Order 25-08
ACCEPTING RESIGNATION OF AND DISCHARGING CYNDI LYDEN,
ESQ. FROM THE ROLE OF 18TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT DEPUTY PUBLIC
ADMINISTRATOR

Cyndi Lyden, Esq., has informed Public Administrator Marco D. Chayet, Esq. and the Court of her resignation from the role of Deputy Public Administrator for the 18th Judicial District. Ms. Lyden was originally appointed Deputy Public Administrator in February 2014, and her appointment was most recently reaffirmed by the Court in Chief Judge Order 22-03 Regarding the Appointment of Cyndi Lyden, Esq. as 18th Judicial District Deputy Public Administrator.

A Deputy Public Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Chief Judge of the District and the Public Administrator “until such time as the deputy public administrator is discharged by the court or the public administrator or until the deputy public administrator resigns.” C.R.S. § 15-12-619(6). No resignation of a Deputy Public Administrator shall be effective until it is filed with and approved by the Chief Judge of the District. *See id.*

The Court hereby accepts Ms. Lyden’s resignation effective April 30, 2025, with the Court’s gratitude for her many years of service to the 18th Judicial District. The Court hereby DISCHARGES Cyndi Lyden from the role of Deputy Public Administrator. This CJO 25-08 shall replace CJO 22-03.
