| Order on Requests for Expanded Media Coverage  |  |

Upon consideration of the public and media interest in the proceedings in this matter, the Court, in the exercise of its inherent power to provide for the orderly disposition of this case, hereby enters the following Order pertaining to requests for media coverage in this matter.

Public Access to Information and Records Rule 3 provides the standards for authorizing expanded media coverage. In determining whether expanded media coverage should be permitted, the factors the Court shall consider include “[w]hether there is a reasonable likelihood that expanded media coverage

would unduly detract from the solemnity, decorum and dignity of the court.” *Id.* at Rule 3(a)(2)(B).

Relevant to this factor, the oral argument in this case will take place in the first floor courtroom of the Ralph L. Carr Judicial Center, which has limited capacity. Therefore, the Court concludes that expanded media coverage shall be permitted as follows:

- One designated credentialed photographer will be allowed to take still photographs during the oral argument. The photographer shall be positioned in a fixed location as approved by Court personnel.
- The media will be responsible for letting the Court know who the designated media representative will be for still photography. The designated media representative must be credentialed per the Colorado Judicial Department’s Media Credential Policy, which can be found at this link: <https://perma.cc/WZ4Q-DSN6>. The media shall be solely responsible for arranging an open and impartial process for distribution of the photographs, with a distribution point located outside of the Ralph L. Carr Judicial Center. If no agreement can be reached, there

shall be no expanded media coverage of still photography. Neither judges nor other Court personnel shall be called upon to resolve any disputes concerning pooling arrangements.

- Access to and seating in the courtroom is covered by the Decorum Order issued on December 26, 2025.
- Audio or video recording will not be permitted in the courtroom, other than the official livestream on the Court of appeals website, which can be found at this link:

- Members of the media may watch the proceedings via the official livestream. Any member of the media wishing to use audio or video clips from the livestream must submit a request for expanded media coverage, which can be found at this link:

- Members of the media must comply with this Court's December 26, 2025, Decorum Order.

- Judges and Court personnel cannot communicate with members of the media about the case.
