

20TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT PROBATION COURTESY TRANSFER (TOUT)



WHAT IF I'M SENTENCED TO PROBATION, BUT I DON'T LIVE IN BOULDER COUNTY?

You will be required to complete an intake with the Boulder County Probation Department; however, you will be able to have your supervision transferred to the county that you live in (note: there are certain charges and assessment criteria that may change this, please ask about this during your intake).

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE FOR THE TRANSFER TO GO THROUGH?

It can take up to two weeks (14 days) for a transfer request to be approved by the receiving county (a.k.a. the county you live in).

WHAT HAPPENS IF I GET INTO TROUBLE?

Boulder County always retains jurisdiction of your case. The venue does not change even though your supervision is overseen by another county. Should you violate the conditions of your probation, it is possible that a complaint will be filed with the Boulder County Court and you will be required to re-appear before a Judge.

WHAT IF I MOVE?

1. Verification of your address change will need to be provided.
2. You will be required to sign a new agreement to send your supervision to a different county.
3. If you move back to Boulder County, the Boulder County Probation Department will resume supervision of your case.

WHAT IF I HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT MY CASE?

The Probation Officer that you are assigned to will receive all your sentencing paperwork and will be able to assist you. If there are questions that cannot be answered by that Probation Officer, there is a liaison in Boulder that will always oversee your case.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHO MY PROBATION OFFICER IS?

Once your supervision is accepted and assigned in the receiving county, a Probation Officer will reach out to you either via phone, email, or mail to schedule your initial appointment. Make sure your contact information is updated!
