

20TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT ECONOMIC CRIME (ECO) PROBATION



SOME THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT ECONOMIC CRIME (ECO) PROBATION:

Probation Officers (PO) must balance the needs of our clients with concerns for victim(s) and community safety. Ideally, both victim and community safety are enhanced with the growth and success of probation clients. While Probation Officers work to support clients through a very difficult probation program, ultimately clients are responsible for their own success through the choices and decisions they make throughout their supervision. You can contact probation for a copy of the terms and conditions of ECO and probation.

WHAT IF I DON'T UNDERSTAND THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF MY PROBATION?

Communicate with your Probation Officer about questions or concerns. They will help you navigate probation and can help you achieve your goals in a way that does not violate your probation.

WHAT IF I DO SOMETHING THAT VIOLATES MY PROBATION?

Communicate with your PO and treatment provider if you are unsure or believe you violated your probation. Not all violations will result in returning to court. If you're willing and able to learn from your mistakes and communicate with your supervision team, then your team can work with you. However, if your behavior demonstrates unwillingness to comply or demonstrates risk to community safety, then your case may return to court.

HOW MUCH DOES ECO PROBATION COST?

Depending on the nature of the economic offense, a client may be required by probation to have monitoring software installed on their phone and/or computer. This software costs around \$270 to install for one device. Monthly fees for monitoring software are \$65 per month per device. Some clients may be ordered to complete additional treatment programs such as domestic violence, substance abuse, mental health, or others. These can be ordered by the court, or they may be something required by the probation officer in response to client behavior. Some treatment programs can be covered by Medicaid or other insurance providers, and other treatment programs are not covered by any health insurance. Costs of aforementioned treatment programs can range from \$200-\$400 per month.

HOW WILL THIS IMPACT MY EMPLOYMENT?

Due to the nature of economic criminal behavior, ECO probation will have restrictions on where clients can work. Specifically, clients may not be allowed to work in a position that grants them access to finances or personal information of others. You may be required to notify your employer about your economic offense and probation status. That said, probation is dedicated to working with clients in achieving stability and success. There are resources available that probation can help clients access to assist in these areas and other areas of need.
