



How to Discontinue Sex Offender Registration

Know Before You File

- ◆ The Petition is to be filed in the case in which you were adjudicated or entered a guilty plea for a Colorado Court conviction that requires you to register.
- ◆ If the case that requires you to register is not in Colorado, you may file a civil case with the District Court in the County where you reside and pay the appropriate filing fee.
- ◆ To determine if you are eligible to petition the Court, review the sentencing documents along with C.R.S. § 16-22-113 to determine if the offense constitutes a felony or misdemeanor.
- ◆ If you have a disability and need a reasonable accommodation to access the courts, please contact your local ADA Coordinator. Contact information can be obtained from the following website:

Common Terms

- ☒ Petition: Document that officially commences the “Discontinue to Register” process.
- ☒ Petitioner: The person filing a Petition to Discontinue Sex Offender Registration.
- ☒ May: In legal terms, “may” is defined as “optional” or “can”.
- ☒ Shall: In legal terms, “shall” is defined as “required”.

Fees

- ✓ **No filing fee** - For Colorado convictions, or any juvenile adjudications.
- ✓ **\$235.00 filing fee** - For convictions from another state.

Step-by-Step Guide

Step 1: Complete the forms.

- Checklist - JDF 460** (*Only used for Juvenile Delinquency cases*)
- Petition**
Discontinue Sex Offender Registration - Colorado conviction (JDF 461), Or
Discontinue Sex Offender Registration - non-Colorado conviction (JDF 473).
- Notice of Hearing**
Notice of Hearing on Petition - Colorado conviction (JDF 462) OR
Notice of Hearing on Petition - non-Colorado conviction (JDF 474).
 - Only complete the caption. The Court will schedule a hearing (*at least 9 weeks out*) when you file and send the notice to you and the prosecuting attorney. *C.R.S. § 16-22-113(2)(c)*.
- Order**
Order to Discontinue Sex Offender Registration - Colorado conviction (JDF 463) OR
Order to Discontinue Sex Offender Registration - non-Colorado conviction (JDF 475).
 - Only complete the caption.

Certificate of Mailing – JDF 479

- Send the Petition to:
 - 1) Prosecuting Attorney who obtained the conviction.
 - 2) Prosecuting Attorney in the jurisdiction you're filing (if different), and
 - 3) Each law enforcement agency that you are required to register as a sex offender.
- Attach the return receipts/certified mailer for each entity you sent the Petition.
- File the Certificate within 21 days of the Petition.

Step 2: File Documents with the Court.

- File the Petition, Notice of Hearing, and Order with the Court and pay any filing fees.
- Within 21-days of filing the Petition, submit the Certificate of Mailing and attach all return receipts.
- Within 21-days of filing the Petition, submit any documents supporting your eligibility to deregister as a sex offender. Include records showing you completed any Court ordered treatment. Be sure to send a copy to the Prosecuting Attorney.

Step 3: Next Steps and Hearing.

- The Prosecuting Attorney has 63 days to object to the Petition.
- If no objection is submitted, the Court may grant the Petition without a hearing.
- If an objection is submitted, be prepared to present documentation or testimony at the hearing to support your request.
- The Order granting or denying your request may be signed at the end of the hearing.

Step 4: After the Hearing.

- If granted, send a copy of the order to each law enforcement agency and to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation at 690 Kipling Street, Suite 315, Lakewood, CO 80215.
- The Court will provide one certified copy at no cost. Contact the clerk's office for additional certified copies for a fee.
- The Court will notify each victim in writing of its decision if the victim has requested notification.
