- Arraignments and First Hearings for Summonses and Penalty Assessments, including Traffic and Civil Infractions, shall be set on the day and time as follows:

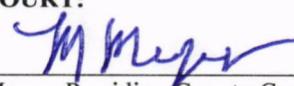

- In regard to citations *alleging violation of any of the 42-4-1301 alcohol offenses, the Court requests that all reasonable efforts be made to make those summons returnable at least twenty-one (21) days but no more than forty-two (42) days from the date of offense, using the chart above for correct day and time.*
- All Summons only citations shall be returnable at the Weld County Court, located at 915 10th Street, Greeley, CO.
- All Penalty Assessment notices shall be made returnable at the Weld County Court, same address. *The court requests that all reasonable efforts be made to make those penalty assessments returnable at least sixty (60) days from date of offense.*
